- 3 The average yield rate for first-time as dropped once again from 35.2% to 35.1%
- 4 Early Decision applications increased by 5% and Early Action application increased by 15%
- 5 Wait list activity increase, for the fall 2016 admission cycle, 39% of institutions used wait list
- 6 The top factors in admission; grades, GPA, test scores, strength of curriculum
- 7 For transfer admission decisions grades matter most
- 8 Student-to-Counselor ratios is 482:1 for public school counselors
